



If you haven't ventured Downtown in a while, what's taken you so long? There are tons of events all year long in the Circle City, and late summer is the perfect time to get out and see all that Downtown Indianapolis has to offer—from theater to sports, from

the great outdoors to an air-conditioned museum. Whether you choose to wander alone or with family, friends, your partner, or others, here are just a few things going on in and around Downtown this summer and beyond.

performing arts

If you prefer your dinner with a show, then the **Indy Fringe Festival's** (719 E. St. Clair St., 522-8099, indyfringe.org) Longest Dinner has a place for you at its table. Come dine on a decadent three-course meal prepared by guest chefs from R Bistro and Black Market while you enjoy live music and authentic street theater performances. Mark your calendar now for August 7 at 6 p.m. (and make sure to book early reservations). For tickets, more information, or to request a vegetarian option, call 431-3304. If you still can't get enough of Indy Fringe, make sure to check out its 10-day festival extravaganza from August 17-26, which showcases hundreds of independent artists in more than 336 shows.

As the summer winds down and the nights become cool and crisp, take your fall fun inside the beautiful **Indiana Repertory Theatre** (140 W. Washington St., 655-5252, irtlive.com). Be sure to catch a performance of the smart and suspenseful *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde*. Adapted by Jeffrey Hatcher from Robert Louis Stevenson's novella, this production takes you from Victorian drawing rooms to the grim alleyways of London as it examines the inner workings of two very different personalities and the ties that bind them dangerously close. Catch the world-renowned show September 5-30.

Classical music more your cup of tea? **The Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra** (Hilbert Circle Theatre, 45 Monument Circle, 639-4300, indianapolisymphony.org) will be humming with the sounds of Beethoven and Dvorak on September 14 at 8 p.m. and September 15 at 5:30 p.m.

Back-to-school madness is quickly approaching, so take your kids for an evening adventure at the **Indianapolis Zoo** (1200 W. Washington St., 650-2001, indyzoo.com) and enjoy the sounds of the Zoo's longest-running concert series, *Animals and All That Jazz*. As the zoo's after hours approach, the grounds are transformed into a new destination with smaller crowds, cooler temperatures, and live music from some of the top names in jazz. And don't plan on eating before your entertainment—the Zoo will offer a full buffet featuring specialty items in addition to traditional Zoo cuisine. Concerts are August 2, 9, and 16 from 5:30-8:30 on the Commons Plaza. Enjoy a night of art and animals on August 23 at the Naturally Inspired Paint Out Silent Auction and Reception inside the Zoo's Hulman Riverhouse at the Gardens. From 5:30-7:30 p.m. guests can sip on wine and enjoy hors d'oeuvres while bidding on the 21 pieces being showcased, with all proceeds supporting the conservation mission of the Indianapolis Zoo. You can expect an eclectic display of art that will range from wood-carved meerkats to "abstract" pieces from animal artists Aurora the walrus and Tombi the elephant. Reservations for the auction are required (call 630-2046) and tickets are \$10 for members and their guests and \$25 for non-members.

Or take the family to the new *Hot Wheels For Real* exhibit at the **Indianapolis Children's Museum** (5000 N. Meridian St., 554-4000, childrensmuseum.org). The exhibit, open until January 27, will have exciting features for generations of the toys' fans, including die-cast cars as well as life-size Hot Wheels muscle cars and hot rods. Guests can also participate in the IZOD Presents Hot Wheels Fearless at the 500 Stunt by using a die-cast car and track set to recreate the record-breaking jump made at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in May 2011.

sports scene

Indianapolis is known as one of the sports capitals of the world, so why not get out and enjoy the plethora of sporting events the Circle City has to offer? If your adrenaline is still pumping from this year's dramatic Indy 500 finish, then get yourself back to the Speedway for more rac-

ing fun. For the speed demons out there, make sure you're at the **Indianapolis Motor Speedway** (4790 W. 16th St., 492-6700, imstix.com) from August 17-19 as they host some of the world's fastest motorcycles at the 2012 Red Bull Indianapolis GP. After getting your speed fix, be sure to take a grounds tour of the richly historical Indianapolis Motor Speedway. The tour includes admission to the IMS museum, as well as a 90-minute tour of the Speedway where you get to take a lap around the track, visit the pagoda, and drive through Gasoline Alley. Tour dates are available in late August, early September, and most of October at \$25 for adults, \$10 for youth ages 6 to 15, and free for ages 5 and under.

With their recent playoff run, the **Indiana Pacers** are in their off-season preparing for another exciting year; however, there's still time to see the women of the **Indiana Fever** (*Bankers Life Fieldhouse*, 125 S. Pennsylvania St., 917-2500, wnba.com/fever) in action. Fever forward Tamika Catchings will be contending for a gold medal on the USA Olympic team and may celebrate a victory in the welcome-back-from-the-Olympics game against Washington on August 16. You can also catch them on their home court vs. Atlanta on August 18, vs. Chicago on September 1, vs. Phoenix on September 9, vs. Seattle on September 12, vs. Minnesota on September 14, and vs. Tulsa on September 23.

Though the **Indianapolis Colts** have

had some recent player shakeups, they're moving forward toward another hopeful season with rookie quarterback Andrew Luck. For those of you looking to display your love for all things blue and white and acquire some new Colts gear, visit the **Colts Pro Shop** (*Circle Centre*, 49 W. Maryland St., 659-2857; *Lucas Oil Stadium*, 500 South Capitol Ave., 262-2700, lucasoilstadium.com/colts-pro-shop). You can sport your

new merch at their first preseason game on August 12 vs. the St. Louis Rams. Call 262-3389 or visit ticketmaster.com for tickets.

If you're looking for a little fun in the sun while you support another Indianapolis team, then venture down to Victory Field and root for the **Indianapolis Indians** (*Victory Field*, 501 W. Maryland St., 269-3545, indianapolis.indians.milb.com). Make sure to catch the home team in action through September 1, and don't miss out on the Friday fireworks after the Indians take on the Toledo Mud on August 31.

After watching your favorite Indianapolis teams all summer, take a trip to the **NCAA Hall of Champions** (700 W. Washington St., 917-6084, ncaahallofchampions.org) for a dose of worldwide sports at the NCAA Olympic Exhibit, on display through October 2012. Since most viewers won't actually get to experience the thrill of the London Olympics in person, get the next best thing by taking an inside look at the journey of former NCAA student-athletes who were also Olympians. While you're there, make your way over to the Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Timeline as the NCAA celebrates the 40th anniversary of Title IX. Hours: Tuesday-Saturday, 10 a.m.-5 p.m., and Sundays noon-5 p.m.



The library is open every day except Wednesday from noon–5 p.m.

For those who favor strolling through an air-conditioned museum for their end-of-summer entertainment, go for a day-long trip to the **Indianapolis Museum of Art** (4000 Michigan Rd., 925-1351, imamuseum.org), where you can tour the museum, garden, and 100-acre art park for free from Tuesday-Sunday. Take a dive into the fashion world as you explore the exhibit, *An American Legacy: Norell, Blaws, Halston and Sprouse*, which celebrates fa-

Satisfy your inner cowboy and take a step into the Quest for the West exhibit at the **Eiteljorg Museum of American Indians and Western Art** (500 W. Washington St., 656-9578, eiteljorg.org) from September 7-9. This one-of-a-kind exhibit showcases 50 of the most recognized names in Western art and is the perfect warm-up to the West Fest on September 29, 10 a.m.–5 p.m., which features a blacksmith at work, musical performances, storytelling, and much more. Tickets for West Fest are \$9 for adults, \$5 for youth, and \$8 for members.

If you're an art lover and looking for a night out on the town, then **IDADA's First Friday Art Tour** is the place to be

from 6–9 p.m. on the first Friday of every month. Known for being one of the biggest events in the local art scene, these tours are in their seventh year and now have approximately 50 participating galleries—so make sure to look at the map at idada.org to plan your evening. Once you arrive, grab a glass of wine and wander through an endless art journey as you talk with local artists and are welcomed into the art community.

While finding your way around IDADA's First Friday Art Tour, make sure to stop in at the **Kurt Vonnegut Memorial Library** (*The Emelie Building*, 540 N. Senate Ave., 652-1954, vonnegutlibrary.org) to get a glimpse into the life of Indiana native Kurt Vonnegut, one of the greatest Ameri-

can Indiana-born fashion designers' influence on American fashion. If you want to learn more about the history of modern photography, make sure to visit *Snapshot: Painters and Photography, Bonnard to Vuillard*, through September 2. The *Wall Street Journal* has declared this exhibit a must-see for anyone interested in 20th-century art. The IMA will also curate the works of more than 20 artists to be on display at CityWay in the Circle City's first modern boutique hotel: The Alexander. As fall breezes in, you can find the **Penrod Arts Fair**, which is known as one of the nation's largest single-day art fairs, on the museum's grounds from 9 a.m.–5 p.m. on September 9. Find out why Penrod is called "Indiana's nicest day."

For the ultimate Downtown experience, go for a journey along the **Cultural Trail** (651-6542, indyculturaltrail.org) and see everything the Circle City has to offer. Whether you're looking to ride bikes, go for a walk, or even take a boat ride along the canal, the Cultural Trail will connect you to five Downtown cultural districts, including Fountain Square, Indiana Avenue, Mass Ave, The Canal & White River State Park, and the Wholesale District. To go for a ride as you take it all in, rent bikes at **Bicycle Garage Indy: Downtown** (*Indy Bike Hub YMCA at City Market, 222 E. Market St., Ste. E101, 612-5099, bgindy.com*) and continue on your way as



you move along the Downtown hub of the city's greenway and trail system. If you want to take a break for a ride along the water, you can find boat rentals at **Wheel Fun Rentals** (459 W. Ohio St., Firehouse #15, 767-5072, wheelfunrentals.com). As you sail north along the canal, you'll see more of the historical destinations Indianapolis has to offer, such as **Military Park** and the **Congressional Medal of Honor Memorial** (medalofhonormemorial.com). While continuing north, make sure to stop at the Canal Cafe Terrace at the **Indiana State Museum** (650 W. Washington St., 252-1637, indianamuseum.org) for their final Summer Sounds Concert Series: Biscuit Miller & The Mix on August 16 from 5:30-7:30. Call ahead to make sure you reserve your spot. 🌟



f you were here for the Super Bowl Village, you know that Georgia Street was the spotlight of success everyone was buzzing about. With all of the potential that locals and tourists saw in this one-of-a-kind street, Indianapolis Downtown Inc. has

partnered with the city of Indianapolis to make Georgia Street the place to be when you're in the Circle City. Think San Diego's Gaslamp Quarter or Columbus, Ohio's Short North—districts filled with restaurants, shops and outdoor cafes—and that's what Georgia Street manager Melissa Thompson hopes it will become. "Our vision is to make Georgia Street the

cal favorites like The Old Spaghetti Factory, Tilted Kilt, and Howl at the Moon, which have never had an outdoor presence, will feature new outdoor eating spaces. The goal of the outdoor rooms will be to create a homey ambience where people can settle in and feel comfortable, says Julia Watson, vice president of marketing and communication for IDI.

You might be asking yourself: Why Georgia Street? Thompson admits that the suddenly trendy stretch of road used to be less than glam; however, \$12.5 million invested for the original project is continuing to be used to create a striking space filled with pedestrian boardwalks, an overhead lighting system, and landscaping that stretches over the three-block

a major venue for convention parties, festivals, fairs, and much more. "You can't just go rent a street anywhere else," says Thompson. "We don't have anything like it. So I think it's something innovative and new that people will want to try."

New and innovative might not be words that you typically use to describe the Hoosier capital, but Georgia Street is breaking that stereotype in many ways. "Because of the outstanding Super Bowl Village attendance Downtown, the NFL is now requiring every Super Bowl city to have a village," says Thompson. The Georgia Street renovations have also produced another surprising feature with its built-in sustainability system. The materials used are locally sourced and recyclable, but more importantly, there is an innovative built-in filtration system underneath the boardwalk, which manages the storm water run-off in order to reuse it for plant irrigation and decrease the amount of run-off going into the city's sewers.

While you might be surprised that Indy is becoming a model for other cities, Watson says that is starting to change. "Indy isn't typically known as early adapters of innovation. But, when people take a second look, I think they see that we really are," says Watson. "We have a very solid public-private partnership model that I think other cities and organizations look to all the time to see how we are doing things in Indy."

Georgia Street's Super Bowl Village delivered the thrill of a lifetime, says Thompson. However, moving forward, Thompson is hopeful that people will embrace Georgia Street not only as a great Super Bowl destination, but also as a place to make new memories with family, co-workers, and friends.

With all of the final touches being completed this year, the Georgia Street Project will continue to evolve in layers, with shopping spaces in the future, depending on the reuse of the former Nordstrom building. But don't let that stop you from making your way down to Georgia Street's newly opened outdoor cafes as you experience the new must-see destination in the Circle City.

"It's a street unlike any other in Indianapolis, and it's way more than a street," says Watson. "You won't see anything like this anywhere else." ❖



destination and event center that people want to be at 24/7," she says.

In order to unveil Georgia Street as the place to be, IDI has raised the caliber to a whole new level, revamping every single one of the street's eateries, says Thompson. Instead of hunting for a restaurant that offers outdoor seating, you'll be flooded with options as you stroll down the new Georgia Street. The occasional temporary seating that you found in the past will be completely replaced, as Georgia Street's restaurants are being required to create outdoor rooms complete with permanent seating and enticing landscaping. Even lo-

cal favorites like The Old Spaghetti Factory, Tilted Kilt, and Howl at the Moon, which have never had an outdoor presence, will feature new outdoor eating spaces. The goal of the outdoor rooms will be to create a homey ambience where people can settle in and feel comfortable, says Julia Watson, vice president of marketing and communication for IDI.

"One of the best parts of IDI's involvement in this project is that we are concerned about the success of all of Downtown and are creating partnerships with adjacent attractions like the Fieldhouse and the Convention Center," says Thompson. This will allow Georgia Street to be






